For 11 1/2 years, Operation Freedom Paws has rescued hundreds of dogs from an uncertain fate and helped 460 clients. You have played a vital role in furthering our mission of service, and for that and so much more, we can't say this enough-

Operation Freedom Paws (OFP) began its journey in 2010 and became a non-profit in September 2011. Year over year, we have continued to build our program and expand our organizational reach to serve more clients and their families. As we get ready to enter our second decade of non-profit work, we remain committed to empowering veterans, first responders, children and other individuals with disabilities to transform their lives.

We continue to work hard to provide our clients with the comprehensive and effective healing modalities and services they deserve. While service dogs are a crucial part of our program, our work isn't just about these amazing four-legged healers. There are many tools and services we offer our clients along their healing journeys. To make that happen, we need to raise an average of \$20,000 to fund each service dog team.

During our 48-week service dog training program, mental health therapists are available at every class, and outside of class, for one-on-one sessions. Through our partnership with the Stella Center and its world-renowned doctors, we can offer clients who medically qualify, the Stellate Ganglion Block to treat the biological wounds of trauma and post-traumatic stress. OFP further supports clients with access to physical therapy equipment, outings, gas cards and veterinarian care for service dogs in training. OFP mentor-trainers are there to assist in filing Veterans Administration ratings through Veteran Service Offices (VSO), advocate for housing rights, and connect on a call 365 days a year, because sometimes help can't wait. We believe in family support and inclusion in the training and therapy process, because healing does not happen in isolation. And when we say, "we've got your 6," those are not empty words. We are in this together!

OFP remains committed to providing exceptional client services and living the core values of this organization with a dedication to enhancing the physical, emotional, and mental well-being of our clients and their families.

## **Everything I Need to Thrive**

Our client Jeri, is an Army veteran who experiences post-traumatic stress related to her military service.

Here she shares in her own words her healing journey with us.

Prior to Operation Freedom Paws, I had tried various therapeutic modalities with some success; however, I was merely surviving and desperately wanted to thrive. Resistant at first, I lent myself to the process. I'd grown weary of the suicidal thoughts and self-imposed limitations.

I applied in November 2019 and was matched with Curly in March 2020. When introduced to this German Shepherd/Great Pyrenees mix, I was taken aback by not only his size but the fact that German Shepherds had terrified me. I momentarily felt as if a mistake had been made. Certainly, I would have been matched with a dog no more than 15 pounds. So glad that they knew better than me. Mary often reminded us, "You don't get the dog you want. You get the dog you need."

COVID-19 restrictions had become a new reality, but I found I was more social than ever with training opportunities and the attention Curly was getting. Curly went to work with me each day and our relationship developed. I learned to become less shy and embrace that people were generally nice, trustworthy, and curious.

During those initial weeks and months of self-doubt, I was frequently reminded by the support



team to trust myself and to not give up. My therapist at OFP would often say, "Giving up is not an option." I carry those words with me each day.

Looking back, I can't believe I kept pushing through and am exceptionally proud of myself for not yielding to the familiar limiting fear and uncertainty. Even more significant and rewarding than any of my past accomplishments was the day Curly and I graduated, April 8, 2021. Without question, it was my happiest moment. We did it! And, he was officially mine.

Curly is a wonderful dog as is this organization who rescued him. He is the love of my life and I am still learning from him every day. He is so smart, gentle, funny, and affectionate. He makes my life full with his unyielding love, acceptance, protection and joy. He keeps me on track with alerts when I "check out" or when my body chemistry is off.

On March 30, 2021, at no cost to me, Mary afforded me an additional source of recovery, the Stellate Ganglion Block. This is a procedure that has evidence to support an improved quality of life and reduction of symptoms for people with post-traumatic stress. On our drive home from the procedure (yes, Mary was with me the entire time!) I have a vivid memory of the colors of the trees, the sky, and a feeling of comfort. It was and is still the case today, as if the sunglasses had come off and the world was brighter and more inviting. I'm blown away by the reduction in anxiety, increased attention to detail, and heightened ability to learn and problem solve.

Currently, I'm nearly completely present and engaged in life. I started working full-time and I'm pursuing an exciting new medical skill set. What a journey this has been! During those inevitable moments of self-doubt, I look at Curly and am reminded that pushing past fear has tremendously rewarding results.

## OFP Daycare and Boarding - The Dog Days of Summer An Update from Renee, Director of Operations

While summer may be coming to a close and kids are back to school, that doesn't mean the hottest days of the year are behind us. August has some of the biggest scorchers on record throughout the United States. The dog days of summer and early fall can really bring the heat! So it's important to be mindful of the higher temperatures and your dog's safety, long after the summer vacations are over.

We all know that hotter days present unique challenges and health concerns for your dogs, first and foremost, overheating. That's why it's important to provide cool, clean, drinking water for them at all times. Going out for a walk or hike? Take a portable water bowl and bottle. If at all possible, allow your dog to stay inside during the hottest times of the day. Try to plan your walks for early mornings or late afternoons. Like your dogs, you reap the health benefits from staying out of the prime heat of the day. On your outings, look for shady spots where you and your dog can rest and recharge.

During your daily travels, never leave your dog alone in your vehicle, even if the windows are down. The inside of your vehicle gets exponentially hotter than the outside temperature very quickly. While unintentional, we can pose a serious health risk to our dogs that can sadly be life-threatening. If you see an animal in an unattended car, contact the police immediately for assistance. The owner probably doesn't realize the danger their dog is in, and time is critical.









It's important to know the signs of heatstroke. Excessive panting, drooling, vomiting, diarrhea, and uncoordinated movements can all be indicators. Dogs at high risk are puppies, seniors, overweight dogs, short snout dogs (Pugs, Bulldogs, Frenchies, Boxers), and heavy coated dogs (Goldens, Huskies, Great Pyrenees). If you think your dog is experiencing heatstroke, move them to a cool area and call your veterinarian immediately. Your vet may advise you to pour cool not cold water on their belly to avoid shock and help them gradually cool down. It's generally recommended to let them drink small amounts of cool, and again, not cold water. At OFP Daycare and Boarding, we provide kiddie pools, plenty of cool drinking water, a shaded play area, and misters to help keep our furry guests comfortable and hydrated.

Another thing to consider when the sun has been beating down all day is the temperature of the pavement, sand, and grass. Dog paw pads are not adaptable to heat, so it's best to apply the 5-second rule here. Place the back of your hand on the ground and if you can't hold it there for five seconds, then it's too hot for your dog to walk on. You can also look at buying booties to protect your dog's feet. It will take some training and adjustment on your dog's part, but booties can really make a difference.

Then there's your dog's coat. Some dogs benefit from a clipping (your vet will know) and other dogs need their coats to help keep them cool (believe it or not!). Maybe you have a thin coated light-colored dog that needs doggie sunscreen. Be mindful not to use human sunscreen, that can be toxic for your dog. You'll want to use a highly trusted sunscreen made specifically for dogs. We recommend you check to make sure your dog is free of fleas, ticks, and foxtails. A tick and flea protocol prescribed by your vet can help to protect against life-threatening bacteria carried by their hosts. And finally, a good ear check is crucial. Humidity, heat, and water activities can increase your dog's risk for ear infections.

We hope these tips help you and your favorite furry companion to beat the heat and continue to some great memories in the great outdoors.
